FIRE MONDAY EVENING.

Fire was discovered on Monday evening in the north end of Cooley Mfg. Co., and had it been later in the evening doubtless the entire plant would have been destroyed. The fire was discovered by one of the employes of G. E. Moody's mill who at once commenced blowing the whistle which brought out a call of the fire bell.

The Hose Co., was prompt in getting at the fire but before the water was turned on, the fire was nearly out by the use of a small stream of water by the members of the Cooley Mfg. Co., who were in the interior of the building.

It is thought that the fire was caused by a spark from the foundry. The loss was slight.
