

Farm Buildings Burned To Ground Late At Night

Blaze Attracted Hundreds
To Scene As Entire Farm
Property Was Destroyed

Ten Cows Lost

Martin Goyette, Owner Had
Let Insurance Lapse But
Few Days Before

Fire of unknown origin destroyed the farm buildings owned by Martin Goyette Saturday night. The place was located on the Montpeller road near the Blue Haven Camps and was occupied by Joseph Lebell.

Mr. Lebell was awakened by a noise about 11:30 o'clock. Arising to investigate he saw a bright light which he at first thought was from an automobile but at once he found the flames bursting from the hay barn through into the house. The buildings which were all attached were quickly in flames. The Waterbury Fire Department was called out but to no avail.

Ten cows were lost, also a large part of the furniture besides a valuable chest of carpenter's tools. Two horses, a calf and part of the poultry were saved. The loss is only partly covered with insurance.

The Lebell family are staying for the present with Wm Goyette who is Mrs. Lebell's father. The Goyette place was known years ago as the Ferris place and later was the home of Mr. and Mrs. D. D. Donovan. Mr. Donovan sold to Floyd Fuller. While Mr. Fuller was living there some fifteen years ago the original house was burned after which a part of the barn was remodeled into living quarters.
