## Arson Probe Is Ordered In State Hospital Fire

Arson is suspected in a fire Fisher said last night at the Vermont State, matches and a jackknife by the Hospital in Waterbury and state baled rags which were blazing fire investigators and hospital when firemen arrived. staff members are investigating today.

At 7 last night, 20 Waterbury firemen, two engines, and an emergency unit went to the hospital and extinguished a fire in several bales of rags stored in the basement of the hospital's "10 North" building.

There were no injuries and little damage was done to the building.

Thirty-two male patients were evacuated by the staff before firemen arrived.

Firemen entered the building with self-contained air supplies, and used smoke ejectors to clear the air following the blaze.

The practice of storing the rags, for sale to a Burlington firm, was termed "a hospital tradition of sorts," by director George Brooks. He said it is "a grossly un economical" practice, which is likely to be discontinued.

The investigation, which now centers on patients with arson histories, is not yet completed.
